## **New Lunch Program**

- JPII will be starting a new hot lunch program, provided by David Alan Catering
- Hot lunch will be offered 5 days a week.
- Meals will be purchased on a monthly basis, instead of every 16 weeks.
- Each month a menu for the following month will be sent home via backpack mail.
   Select the meals you would like to purchase, return the completed form and payment via backpack mail.
- 3 days a month a chef from the company will come to the school to cook on site for the students.
- All lunches come with a protein, a starch, a fruit or vegetable, and water or milk.
- All meals follow the national standards for nutrition.
- The company will be providing hot boxes to keep the food warm for all lunch waves.
- There will be a staff member from the company to distribute lunches. Volunteers will still be needed for set-up, clean-up, selling snacks, and monitoring students.
- For the rest of this year, all orders will be on paper, but next year there is the
  possibility to move to an online ordering/payment format.
- For the rest of this year, the lunch program will continue to serve as a fundraiser for the school.
- Once the new lunch program begins, feedback on the lunches is welcome.
- The cost per lunch is not completely determined at this time. Currently, it is
  estimated to be about \$8.00 per meal. Portions and cost based on grade (for
  example, an 8th grader eats more than a Kindergartener) are also being looked
  into.
