Faculty

FAQs

Why do people choose Catholic education for their children?

The most quoted reasons parents chose Catholic schools are any or all of the following: faith formation; academic rigor; value-added education; safe environment; parental involvement.

Does my child have to be Catholic to attend?

St. John Paul II School warmly welcomes children of all faiths and is respectful of each student's religious tradition. All students will study the scriptures and traditions of the Catholic faith, attend Mass and religious functions, and study religion as part of the curriculum. While non-Catholic students are expected to participate in these aspects of school life, they are not required to give assent to the Catholic faith. We believe we are greatly enriched by our relationship with those of other faiths.

Are the teachers qualified?

St. John Paul II School teachers are CT certified, or currently in the process of certification. Most have advanced degrees. Many have several years experience. Each teacher is involved in ongoing professional development to stay current with the best practices in teaching and learning in his or her subject.

What will my child study?

The course of study includes reading and writing (language arts), mathematics, social studies, science, religion, Spanish, art, music (vocal and instrumental), technology, and physical education.

What extracurricular activities are available?

Activities planned include sports such as basketball, soccer, volleyball, golf; Girl Scouts/Daisies, Boy Scouts, band, drama, Student Council, Engineering with Legos, team-building club, Praise Team, Math Counts, Service Teams, Invention Convention.

Is there a dress code?

Yes, PreK-8th grade students wear uniforms and follow the dress code described in the student handbook.

Will there be before or after school care?

Yes, before school care is available from 7:00 a.m. and after school extended care will run until 5:30 p.m. There is a nominal per hour fee for after school extended care.

Do you have a preschool program?

Yes, we offer a prekindergarten program for children turning 4 by December 31st of the school year. This is offered full-time, five days or three days. The program provides a strong foundation for kindergarten.

Is busing available?

Yes, to Middletown residents for students in grades K-8th.

Can I be involved?

Yes, we consider parents our partners and offer many ways for you to be involved. Our Home School Association is an organization of parents who promote the school by sponsoring activities and fundraising for school projects and enhancements for students. We love to have parents involved!

When can I enroll?

St. John Paul II School has a rolling admissions policy, so application can be made anytime. However, we preserve smaller class sizes to maximize learning therefore, classes may fill.

Academics

Reading/Literature/Language Arts

Learning to read is critical to a child's future learning in school. St. John Paul II is dedicated to providing instruction that develops strong, competent readers. In the early grades the focus is on phonics, reading comprehension, and oral fluency. **The Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA2)** is used three times per year to measure progress of K–3 readers. This helps teachers individualize students' reading instruction, and, if needed, intervene with additional support. In the middle grades, the focus shifts to enriched literature, reading comprehension, close reading and textual evidence with a strong emphasis on writing.

Spanish Immersion Program

St. John Paul II School offers a unique Spanish program that offers full language immersion in grades 1–5, focusing on conversation and vocabulary. These fast-paced, engaging classes are "Spanish only" and students love them. Students are well prepared to proceed in middle school (grades 6–8) to a high school preparation program focused on Spanish reading, writing, and grammar.

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics

St. John Paul II's commitment to ongoing **STEM** (**Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics**) education begins early and extends throughout the student's education at JPII.

- In science, K–5 students build a foundation with the highly regarded, interactive **Nancy Larson Science Program**. In the state of the art science lab, middle school students explore earth, physical and life science. Field trips and special science programs supplement our classes.
- Technology is integrated throughout the curriculum through weekly technology classes, interactive boards, a mobile laptop lab, android tablets, and supplemental apps and online programs. Our seventh and eighth graders receive a Windows laptop as part of our 1:1 program.
- K-5 students learn coding & engineering principles in technology classes and through Engineering with Legos and Invention Convention. Middle school students may participate in Junior Robotics & Engineering Club.
- Mathematics is a core course in all grades, with a focus on skill fluency, problem solving and application. Middle school math is leveled so that each student has the opportunity for success at his or her own pace. Offerings progress to Algebra and Advanced Algebra.



Home and School Association


